Glen McGinnis was a dedicated and loyal teacher, coach, and mentor at Cornwall Central Schools. He spent over 50 years teaching and coaching in the district and was beloved by all. He had an enormous impact on the lives of the students he taught and players he coached.

The gymnasium at Cornwall High School is named in honor of Coach McGinnis. The plaque on the wall speaks to his dedication and loyalty to Cornwall CSD. It reads. "As a dedicated teacher and coach, Glen McGinnis served the Cornwall Central School District for over 50 years. A 1952 graduate of Cornwall-on-Hudson High School... Coach McGinnis returned to Cornwall in 1958 as a teacher and head coach. During his career he served as boys basketball and baseball head coach and after retiring, he served as an assistant in girls soccer and softball, and boys basketball... Coach McGinnis will forever be remembered for his dedication to and love of all things Cornwall"
