### A Guide to the Fair Treatment of High School Basketball Coaches

BCANY Executive Director Dave Archer, also serves as the Senior Director of Operations for the National High School Basketball Coaches Association. Dave played a major leadership role in getting the Guide written, endorsed and released this August.

There are changing dynamics in high school sports throughout the country. Being a scholastic basketball coach nowadays is a multi-faceted challenge. The ground rules and landscape are ever changing. The pressure, expectations, time commitment and the use of social media are huge challenges for scholastic coaches.

At the same time we seem to see more high school basketball coaches being fired or not rehired. Some of these actions are surely justified, while others are not. Unfortunately, many times a coach is not provided a reason as to why he or she is not being re-hired. Also, at times the process used to make a decision to not rehire a coach is not as fair and transparent as it could be.

We think high school basketball coaches should be treated fairly. We understand that scholastic coaches in most cases are at will employees with no tenure nor job security. We think they still deserve to be treated fairly in regard to their employment.

We think A Guide to the Fair Treatment of High School Basketball Coaches provides a good framework and suggestions that can followed in relations between a school district and a basketball coach. These guidelines were prepared by Ropes & Gray LLP, the legal counsel to the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The NHSBCA is the national voice for high school basketball coaches, working to foster high standards of professionalism and to support coaches. ### Status of High School Basketball Coaches by Dave Archer

We are deeply concerned about the status and role of scholastic coaches in today's society. Unrealistic parents, wide-reaching critical social media, and often non-supportive administrators make the job of coaching in high school very difficult.

- 1. Now that A Guide to the Fair Treatment of High School Basketball Coaches has been published, we will work to get fair minded educational leaders and administrators to understand the situation and to hopefully employ the concepts in the document.
- BCANY will be working with other state basketball coaches associations to develop a process to recruit more educators to coach in our schools. We are also working on putting together a process to develop new coaches.
- 3. We are working nationally to increase and re-emphasize the role of the high school coach in the college recruiting process.

### 2016 Summer Hoops Festival



This allows our players to become more globally aware and involved citizens. As a professional organization, BCANY provides many events where the coaches have the ability to participate and grow. Our fall clinic will be held on September 30th at SUNY Cortland. This clinic is designed by coaches for coaches. The clinic will provide networking opportunities with over 200 New York State coaches. There will be on court presentations from prominent speakers, 9 mini-clinic workshops, along with round table discussions. I highly encourage more coaches to get involved and attend this professional event.

Our Summer Hoops Festival, held this past August 5-7th was a complete success. It provided exposure to some of the finest boys and girls basketball players from across the state. This showcase event was attended by more than 50 college coaches. I would personally like to thank our Section 4 representative, Kurt Ehrensbeck, for his coordination as director of this fantastic event. Once again, I encourage more coaches to take on such leadership roles in our organization. We are stronger and better when more

members are actively involved and committed to the success of this organization's events.

As president over the next two years, I feel increased membership and attendance is imperative to the success of BCANY. I have two direct initiatives for the membership:

### Survey of Alabama prep coaches highlights issues with parents By Kevin Hoffman, Editorial Director

A recent survey of Alabama high school coaches revealed that nearly two-third of them have quit or considered leaving their positions due to issues with parents.

The survey was conducted by <u>AL.com</u> and more than 300 high school coaches responded. Coaches were asked about their problems with parents, how they handled the issues, and how those conflicts affected their decisions and the student-athletes who were caught in the middle.

In the survey, 63% of coaches said they've quit or considered quitting their jobs because of combative parents.

"Many parents today don't want their kids coached," said one of the surveyed coaches. "They want them pampered. They want to know what's in it for their child, not what's best for the team."

### Here are some other highlights of the survey:

- 1. **60%** of coaches say their experiences with parents have worsened over their careers.
- 2. In characterizing the problems, **29**% said conflicts were due to playing time. **18**% said helicopter parenting, and **17**% said criticism of strategy.
- 3. **64%** of coaches said athletes have complained about their parents' conduct. "The kid stated that he is torn between doing what I say and doing what his mom or dad says," one coach responded.
- 4. **93%** said the school administration had their backs during conflicts with parents.
- 5. **89%** said boosters have threatened or withheld funds because of a coach or his/her staff.
- 6. **79%** said they haven't adjusted their style over a parent's complaints.
- 7. **68%** said the growth of travel/club teams has made relationships with parents worse. "Parents assume all club team coaches must be great and know what they're doing because it's deemed 'elite' play."
- 8. **43%** said a parent has threatened to transfer their child to another school.
- 9. **32%** blamed the pursuit of scholarships for the rise in problematic parents. **31%** said it's due to the travel/club environment.

The Following Awards will be presented at the Fall Clinic, in addition to the State-Wide Coach of the Year Awards.

The plaques are symbolic in nature to recognize achievements in the basketball coaching profession and will be presented at the Annual Clinic at SUNY Cortland on September 30, 2016.
